## **Capitation Fees**

Board chair Guy Diston attended the Bowls NZ AGM as a delegate for the Central region. He reported on the fate of the Bowls NZ remit on a possible change to the way in which Capitation fees are collected as follows:

"The Bowls NZ remit to change to a charge per green model was rejected by the clubs - however all the delegates agree that in the vast majority clubs do want a simpler system and that with some minor tweaks added to ensure the small clubs are not financially penalized it should get voted through by way of an SGM during the year."

## Paraparaumu Beach Invitation 2 x 4 x 2 Pairs

The Paraparaumu Beach club opened the season with its annual invitation 2 x 4 x 2 Pairs for both men and women. The *Steinlager* & *Assure Kapiti Court Motel* Masters Men's 2-4-2 Pairs was played over the three days 7-9 September and drew the usual very strong field with many visiting players from outside this Centre. Begun in 1994 this was the 25 th competition of this prestigious tournament played in fine but cold breezy weather. With no weather interruptions play went to schedule.

The Masters final was contested between a composite team of Kapiti Coast rep **Peter Thomson** and **Graeme Cooley** (Manawatu) and **John Roberts** and **Kevin Hills** (Taranaki) with Thomson and Cooley running out comprehensive winners.

The following weekend it was the turn of the women in the *Ray White (Villa Real Estate Ltd*, Paraparaumu Beach) 2 x 4 x 2 Pairs. This tournament was first held in 2004 and it has always been sponsored by the same real estate company. This early season tournament is the biggest women's tournament in the region and it attracts many teams from as far away as Taranaki, Wanganui and across to Manawatu and Wairarapa and down to the Hutt Valley and Wellington.

The event was won by was won by **Nellie Hewson** and **Trish Howard** from New Plymouth with the runners up being **Dawn Neill** and **June Wairau** (Titahi Bay). The weather was excellent. #### 80th Anniversary of the Paraparaumu beach bowling club

Paraparaumu Beach Bowling Club had their Opening Day on 1 September and with the opening of the new season the Club celebrated their 80 th anniversary.

The inaugural meeting of the proposed bowling club was held at the Majestic Hotel in July 1938 and the club was formed at a general meeting the following month. In November 1939 the club duly affiliated with the Wellington Bowling Centre and held an opening ceremony on 18 November 1939. Mr E E Hammond became President in 1940 with Mrs E Henderson becoming the women's president in 1946.

The original bowling club was on Kapiti Road then, in 1968, the Club moved to where it is now in Toru Road. With the Club's inception in 1939 there were separate divisions, one for men and one for women and each had their own president, own board and managed their own competitions, although they all played on the same green. In 1996 the two sections amalgamated to become one, with Mrs Beryl Doyle becoming the first president of the amalgamated club.

Back in time the club catered mainly for full time bowlers but these days club members can choose between highly competitive or social bowling programmes,

There was a field of 32 teams with teams coming from Christchurch right through to Auckland, plus teams from Australia.

## John Evans, Paraparaumu Beach green keeper, has retired.

John joined the club in 1976 and he initially worked in partnership with his father (Bert) as greens keeper for both Paraparaumu Beach and Kapiti Bowling Clubs. He took over fully when Bert retired in 1982. Over the early years working together with assistance from Colin Evans (John's uncle) they converted the majority of the Wellington bowling greens from grass to cotula surfaces. Additionally they cored and grooved bowling greens and golf courses in the lower half of the North Island.

In 1995 he was elected to Bowls NZ Green Keeping and four years later was elected President a position he held for four years. He has been on the Board of NZ Sports Turf Institute and Chairman of NZ Sports Turf Industry Training organisations. John has been awarded the coveted Certificate of Merit presented jointly by the Green Keepers Association and the President of Bowls NZ, the highest award green keepers can achieve.

As a bowler John has won many club titles, Kapiti Centre titles and one Wellington Centre title.

The bowling club has been indeed fortunate to have a man with this knowledge and skill to prepare our bowling surfaces. We are also fortunate that John has trained and passed his knowledge on to his successor- **Scott Sinclair-Paton.** Berenice Crowther

## News from the Otaki Bowling Club

Since celebrating its Centenary in 2008 the Otaki Bowling Club has continued to meet the challenges of a fluctuating and, increasingly a loss of membership, compounded by a lack of participation by many of the members it still has – a nationwide problem for our sport. 2014 saw a 35% drop of membership compared to that of 2008. Even with a turnaround and membership trending upwards from that point in 2016 the Club still found it lacked the depth of active members to realistically participate competitively in Centre competitions.

Then In 2017 the Club was blessed with the arrival of three former representative players - Paul Selby and Jane Selby-Paterson and Ronnie Crone - who had moved into the District. At the same time the Executive and members of both the Otaki Bowling Club and the Otaki Railway Bowling Club were holding discussions about the best way forward for both clubs. These discussions have proved to be positive with members of both Clubs' recognising and accepting that by joining forces it would be a "win-win" for both Clubs. Rather than become one amalgamated club there is currently a trial period where Otaki Railway Club members are full members of the Otaki Bowling Club, however they will retain their autonomy and identity by playing their own championships and galas out of the Otaki club. They are also able to play in composite teams in Inter-club and pennant competitions with the assent of the Centre. It is many years since either Club has been in the position where they have been able to field men's teams in both Premier Div I and II Interclub as they have this season, as well as fielding a women's team and entering one team in the mid-week Bowls3Five competition, and teams in both Men's and women's Div II Pennants.

The Otaki Bowling Club is seriously determined to reach its goal of becoming a vibrant family club in the local community. Already a joint constitution is shared with the Otaki Petanque Club, afternoon and evening Indoor Bowling is provided along with weekly card afternoons, whilst family groups are catered for in the Business house/Twilight Summer programme.

Such is the Club's confidence in its future its Executive is taking positive steps to replace the #1 green playing surface in time for the 2019 – 20 season.
